PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY

- a. Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open since open door operation can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy.
 It is important not to defeat or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- b. Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaner residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.
- c. Do not operate the oven if it is damaged. It is particularly important that the oven door closes properly and that there is no damage to the:
 - DOOR (bent)
 - HINGES AND LATCHES (broken or loosened)
 - DOOR SEALS AND SEALING SURFACES
- d. The oven should not be adjusted or repaired by anyone except properly qualified service personnel.

IIMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

To reduce the risk of burns, electric shock, fire, injury to persons or exposure to excessive microwave energy:

- Read all instructions before using the appliance.

- This appliance must be grounded. Connect only to properly grounded outlet. See "GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS" found on page 08.
- Install or locate this appliance only in accordance with the provided installation instructions.
- Some products such as whole eggs and sealed containers for example, closed glass jars are able to explode and should not be heated in this oven.
- Use this appliance only for its intended use as described in the manual. Do not use corrosive chemicals or vapors in this appliance. This type of oven is specifically designed to heat, cook or dry food. It is not designed for industrial or laboratory use.
- HOT CONTENTS CAN CAUSE SEVERE BURNS. DO NOT ALLOW CHILDREN TO USE THE MICROWAVE. Use caution when removing hot items.
- Do not operate this appliance if it has a damaged cord or plug, if it is not working properly, or if it has been damaged or dropped.

- This appliance should be serviced only by qualified service personnel. Contact nearest authorized service facility for examination, repair, or adjustment.
- Do not cover or block any openings on the appliance.
- Do not store this appliance outdoors. Do not use this product near water - for example, near a kitchen sink, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool, or similar location.
- Do not immerse cord or plug in water.
- Keep cord away from heated surface.
- Do not let cord hang over edge of table or counter.
- When cleaning surfaces of door and oven that comes together on closing the door, use only mild, nonabrasive soaps, or detergent applied with a sponge or soft cloth.
- To reduce the risk of fire in the oven cavity:
 - 1). Do not overcook food. Carefully attend appliance when paper, plastic, or other combustible materials are placed inside the oven to facilitate cooking.
 - 2). Remove wire twist-ties from paper or plastic bag before placing bag in oven.
 - 3). If material inside of the oven ignite, keep oven door closed, turn oven off, and disconnect the power cord, or shut off power at the fuse or circuit breaker panel.
 - 4). Do not use the cavity for storage purposes. Do not leave paper products, cooking utensils, or food in the cavity when not in use.
- Liquids, such as water, coffee, or tea are able to be overheated beyond the boiling point without appearing to be boiling. Visible bubbling or boiling when the container is removed from the microwave oven is not always present.

 THIS COULD RESULT IN VERY HOT LIQUID SUD-DENLY BOILING OVER WHEN THE CONTAINER IS DISTURBED OR A UTENSIL IS INSERTED INTO THE LIQUID.

To reduce the risk of injury to persons:

- 1) Do not overheat the liquid.
- 2) Stir the liquid both before and halfway through heating it.
- 3) Do not use straight-sided containers with narrow necks.
- 4) After heating, allow the container to stand in the microwave oven for a short time before removing the container.
- 5) Use extreme care when inserting a spoon or other utensil into the container.

GROUNDING INSTALLATION

This appliance must be grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current. This appliance is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an outlet that is properly installed and grounded.

- A short power-supply cord is provided to reduce the risks resulting from becoming entangled in or tripping over a longer cord.

 - 5) Plug the microwave oven into a different outlet so that microwave oven and receiver are on different branch circuits.

UTENSILS

A CAUTION

Personal Injury Hazard:

Tightly-closed utensils could explode. Closed containers should be opened and plastic pouches should be pierced before cooking.

See the instructions on "Materials you can use in microwave oven or to be avoided in microwave oven." There may be certain non-metallic utensils that are not safe to use for microwaving. If in doubt, you can test the utensil in question following the procedure below.

Utensil Test:

- Fill a microwave-safe container with 1 cup of cold water (250ml) along with the utensil in question.
- Cook on maximum power for 1 minute.
- Carefully feel the utensil. If the empty utensil is warm, do not use it for microwave cooking.
- Do not exceed 1 minute cooking time.

Materials you can use in microwave oven

Utensils	Remarks
Browning dish	Follow manufacturer's instructions. The bottom of browning dish must be at least 3/16 inch (5mm) above the turntable. Incorrect usage may cause the turntable to break.
Dinnerware	Microwave-safe only. Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Glass jars	Always remove lid. Use only to heat food until just warm. Most glass jars are not heat resistant and may break.
Glassware	Heat-resistant oven glassware only. Make sure there is no metallic trim. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Oven cooking bags	Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not close with metal tie. Make slits to allow steam to escape.
Paper plates and cups	Use for short-term cooking/warming only. Do not leave oven unattended while cooking.
Paper towels	Use to cover food for reheating and absorbing fat. Use with supervision for a short-term cooking only.
Parchment paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering or a wrap for steaming.
Plastic	Microwave-safe only. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Should be labeled "Microwave Safe". Some plastic containers soften, as the food inside gets hot. "Boiling bags" and tightly closed plastic bags should be slit, pierced or vented as directed by package.
Plastic wrap	Microwave-safe only. Use to cover food during cooking to retain moisture. Do not allow plastic wrap to touch food.
Thermometers	Microwave-safe only (meat and candy thermometers).
Wax paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering and retain moisture.

Materials to be avoided in microwave oven

Utensils	Remarks
Aluminum tray	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Food carton with metal handle	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Metal or metal-trimmed utensils	Metal shields the food from microwave energy. Metal trim may cause arcing.
Metal twist ties	May cause arcing and could cause a fire in the oven.
Paper bags	May cause a fire in the oven.
Plastic foam	Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid inside when exposed to high temperature.
Wood	Wood will dry out when used in the microwave oven and may split or crack.







PRODUCT OVERVIEW

TURNTABLE INSTALLATION


Cleaning the cooking compartment and putting the turntable in place.

For new installations, make sure all packaging and shipping tape has been removed from the turntable shaft. Before using the appliance to prepare food for the first time, you will need to put the turntable in place correctly. You must clean the cooking compartment and accessories



How to put the turntable in place:

- 1. Place the turntable ring assembly ③ into the recess in the cooking compartment.
- 2. Place the glass tray ① on the turntable ring assembly ③. Fit the raised, curved lines in the center of the glass tray bottom between the three spokes of the shaft. Make sure that the glass tray ① engages in the turntable shaft ② in the centre of the cooking compartment floor. The rollers on the shaft should fit inside the turntable bottom ridge.



- 1. Never use the appliance without the turntable. Make sure that it is properly engaged. The turntable can turn clockwise or anti-clockwise.
- 2. Never place the glass tray upside down. The glass tray should never be restricted.
- 3. Both glass tray and turntable ring assembly must always be used during cooking.
- 4. All food and containers of food are always placed on the glass tray for cooking.
- 5. Never restrict the movement of the turntable.

Notes:

6. If glass tray or turntable ring assembly cracks or breaks, contact your nearest authorized service center.

PRODUCT INSTALLATION


Countertop Installation

Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged.

Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the Waveguide cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

INSTALLATION

 Select a level surface that provide enough open space for the intake and/or outlet vents.



A minimum clearance of 3.0 inches (7.5cm) is required between the oven and any adjacent walls. One side must be open. The minimum installation height is 36 inches(91.4cm).

- (1) Leave a minimum clearance of 12 inches (30cm) above the oven.
- (2) Do not remove the legs from the bottom of the oven.


- (3) Blocking the intake and/or outlet openings can damage the oven.
- (4) Place the oven as far away from radios and TV as possible.
 Operation of microwave oven may cause interference to your radio or TV reception.
- Plug your oven into a standard household outlet. Be sure the voltage and the frequency is the same as the voltage and the frequency on the rating label.

WARNING: Do not install oven over a range cooktop or other heat-producing appliance. If installed near or over a heat source, the oven could be damaged and the warranty would be void.

The accessible surface may be hot during operation.



Control Panel



1. Standby Mode

- (1) When the microwave oven is plugged into an outlet, "0:00" shows on the display. The
- (2) In the process of setting, if there is no operation within 1 minute, the setting is invalid and then the oven go back to standby mode.

2. Setting the Clock

- (1) Press " Timer " twice and ther "00:00" will display.
- (2) Press the number keys to enter the time.

Example: To set the clock to 12:10, please press "1,2,1,0" in turn.

(3) Press " Clock " to confirm. The clock is set.

Notes

- (1) To reset the clock, please repeat step 1 to step 3.
- (2) The clock is a 12-hour display. If the clock is not set, it will not work when powered.

3. Setting the Kitchen Timer

- (1) Press " Clock " once and then "00:00" will display.
- (2) Press the number keys to enter the desired time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (3) Press " Start " to confirm The timer starts counting down.

Notes

- (1) The kitchen timer is different from the 12-hour system. The Kitchen Timer is a timer.
- (2) Any other program can't be set during the kitchen timer.

11 power levels are available.

- (1) Press " Cook " once and then "00:00" will display.
- (2) Press the number keys to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (3) Press " Level " once, "PL10" will display.
- (4) Press the number keys to set the power level. The 11 power levels are available.
- (5) Press " Start " to start cooking.

Notes

- (1) In the process of setting, if the " Stop " is pressed or if there is no operation within 1 minute, the setting is invalid. LOCK +3sec.
- (2) The power level can be changed during operation. Press "Level" once and then the current power will display for 3 seconds. Press the number keys to change the power.

 The oven will work with the selected power.

5. Speedy Cooking

- (1) In standby mode, press "

 Start +30sec. " to cook food with 100% power level for 30 seconds. Each press on the same key can increase 30 seconds and the maximum time value is "99:99".
- (2) In standby mode, pressing the number keys 1 to 6 lets you quickly start a cooking time from 1 to 6 minutes. Then you can press "

 Start +30sec. The maximum time value is "99:99".

Note

In microwave cooking and defrosting by time state, each more press on "

Start
+30sec.
" can
increase the cooking time by 30 seconds. (except defrosting by weight and the auto menu.)

6. Defrost by Weight

- (1) Press " Weight Defrost " once and then the screen will display "dEF1".
- (2) Prese the number ke $_{\rm v}$ s to set the weight of the food. The range of weight is 4~1000z.
- (3) Press " Start 130sec. " to start defrosting.

Note

The buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during defrosting. If no operation, the oven will continue working.

7. Defrost by Time

- (1) Press " Defrost "once and then the screen will display "dEF2".
- (2) Press the number keys to set the desired defrost time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- (3) Press " Power " once, and the screen will display " PL3 ", then press the number keys to set the power level. (If you do not need to change the power level, please skip step 3.)
- (4) Press " Start " to start defrosting.

Notes

- (1) The buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during defrosting. If no operation, the oven will continue working.
- (2) The default power is PL3 and it cannot be changed during defrosting.

8. Multi-Stage Cooking

Example: Defrost food for 5 minutes and then cook with 80% microwave power for 7 minutes.

- (1) Press " Defrost " once and then the screen will display "dEF2".
- (2) Press "5", "0", and "0" to set the desired defrost time to 5 minutes.
- (3) Press "Cook Time "once and then press "7", "0", and "0" to set the cooking time.
- (4) Press " Power once and then "PL10" will display.
- (5) Press "8" to set the power level to PL8.
- (6) Press " Start " to start cooking.

Notes

- (1) Two cooking stages can be set in multi-stage cooking.
- (2) If you set the defrost function, it will work automatically in the first stage.
- (3) The Kitchen Timer, Auto menu cannot be set as one of the multi-stage.
- (4) In the multi-stage cooking, you can increase the cooking time by pressing the

 " Start " in the second stage."

9. Pizza

- (1) In standby mode, press " Pizza repeatedly to select the weight of pizza you want.
 - "4.0¯", "8.0¯" and "14.0¯" will displ<mark>ay in order.</mark>
 - Example: Press " Pizza " once and then "4.0" will display.
- (2) Press " Start " to start cooking

10. Popcorn

- (1) In standby mode, press " pepeatedly to select the weight of popcorn you want.

 Popcorn
 - "1.75" , "3.0¯" and "3.5¯" will display in order.
 - Example: Press " " once and then "1.75 " will display.
- (2) Press " Start 130sec. " to start cooking

11. Auto Menu

- (1) Press " repeatedly to choose the auto menu you need. The 4 auto menus are
 - available. Including A-01, A-02, A-03, A-04.
- (2) Press " +30sec. " to confirm the auto menu.
- (3) Press " Menus " repeatedly to choose the weight of the food.
- (4) Press " Start " to start cooking.

12. Lock Function for Children

You can use this function to disable the screen buttons and prevent your children from accidentally turning the oven on.

To activate the lock:

In standby mode, press and hold "

Stop

cancel

LOCK +3sec."

To deactivate the lock:

In a locked state, press and hold "

Stop

cancel

COCK +3sec."

To three seconds. A long beep sounds.

13. Safety Lock

Safety Lock is a system that safeguards against unintended activation of the oven, providing a protective measure to ensure child safety.

(1) How the safety lock works

Initiating the cooking automatically triggers the lock. The lock will also stay engaged for 30 minutes after cooking ends.

Safety Lock is active by default. It will only be deactivated if the user chooses to do so manually. Even in the event of a power disconnection, the oven will preserve the state of the safety lock, whether it is activated or deactivated.

(2) Unlock the door

Press "Door Open of during operation and open the door within 10 seconds,

or the safety lock will re-engage. The door will stay unlocked until cooking is initiated.

Or:


Press "Open" within 30 minutes after cooking is complete to manually disable the door lock and switch to standby mode. If no key is pressed, the lock will automatically disengage after 30 minutes.

(3) Deactivate the safety lock

If there are no children in the house, you can choose to permanently deactivate the safety lock function.

Press " 7 ", " 9 " in consecutive order and then press and hold " Door Open " for

three seconds within 30 seconds, the screen will display "ULoc", indicating the successful deactivation of the safety lock.



(4) Re-activate the safety lock Press " 7", " 9" in consecutive order and then press and hold " three seconds within 30 seconds, the screen will display "Loc", indicating the successful re-activation of the safety lock. 14. ECO Function To enter ECO mode: " for three seconds. The screen will turn off. In standby mode, press and hold To cancel ECO mode: In ECO mode, pressing any key, or opening and closing the door will cancel it. 15. Mute mode To activate the mute mode: In standby mode, press and hold '8" for 3 seconds. The buzzer will sound. When you press the key, it does not make a sound. To deactivate the mute mode: In mute mode, press and hold "8" for 3 seconds. The buzzer will sound. 16. Inquiring Function (1) If the clock has been set, the current time will display for three seconds by pressing Timer " once in the cooking state. " to inquire about the power level. (2) In the microwave cooking state, press " It will display for three seconds.
